New Stamps

Metropolis Lighthouse (Hope Light), IL

The world's first lighthouse designed for, built for and dedicated to the fight against cancer was officially lit on November 5, 2014. The 30 foot tall light which overlooks the Ohio River in Metropolis, Illinois, is the nation's first "Beacon of Hope" for cancer patients and survivors. The lighthouse was constructed entirely using donated funding and pro bono labor, services and



supplies. The main purpose of the lighthouse is to promote early cancer detection and navigate people to various resources that identify cancer signs and symptoms and where to go for help. In support of this worthy cause, the Society has created a passport stamp for this unique lighthouse that will be available at the Chamber of Commerce, 607 Market St, Metropolis, IL 62960, (618) 524-2714. All donations will be forwarded to the Hope Light Foundation. Walkway bricks are also available providing an opportunity to memorialize a family member or friend affected by cancer.
