Start the Year Right - Create a Stamp Hunting Kit


In the last USLHS Bulletin, we highlighted passport stamp expert, James Hill, who made some suggestions regarding what to carry with you when you go looking for stamps. We would like to reiterate some of the things on his list that might come in handy. In addition to your passport take along:

- Your own ink pad (possibly a couple of different colors). This makes it much easier to get a complete and clearer stamp image. Many locations don't replace their ink pads very often. One pad will last you an entire season!
- Index cards. Once you stamp a square in your book, it is a done deal. The result might be a poor or misplaced image. If you stamp an index card, you can make sure it is a good image and then you can cut it out and glue it in your book.

New Stamps

Happy Birthday Boston Harbor Lighthouse!

In recognition of the 300th Anniversary of the Boston Lighthouse, we have created a brand new stamp design for visitors to Little Brewster Island. In addition, we have created a special anniversary stamp (see sample) that will also be available for those who visit the lighthouse this year. Congratulations to everyone involved in developing this year's celebration, including the current keeper, and USLHS member, our friend Sally Snowman!





Port Pontchartrain Lighthouse, Louisiana

Also known as the Milneburg Lighthouse, it is located along the shore of Lake Pontchartrain on the grounds of the University of New Orleans Research and Technology Park. In addition to its serving as an aid to navigation, the now land-locked lighthouse also served as an office for the Port Pontchartrain Beach Amusement Park! The stamp will be housed at the New Canal Lighthouse Museum and Education Center located a short distance away.

Sombrero Key Lighthouse, Florida

A distant view of this reef light is possible from the eastern end of the 7-mile bridge near Marathon or from Sombrero Beach. This is a new design and will be available at the Marathon Chamber of Commerce & Visitor Center, 12222 Overseas Hwy, Marathon, FL.



Kenosha Pier Lighthouse, Wisconsin

Stamp is available at the Kenosha History Center, 220 51st Place, Kenosha, WI 53140. A duplicate stamp is available at the lighthouse during open hours, 5117 4th Ave, Kenosha, WI

Sunken Rock Lighthouse, New York

Stamp is available at the Alexandria Bay Chamber of Commerce, 7 Market Street, Alexandria Bay, NY. (315) 482-9531. Note: Open M-F 9-4. No donation required. Stamp is not available by mail.





Cedar Island, Orient Point, Long Beach Bar & Plum Island Lighthouses

The Orient Beach State Park, 40000 Main Road, Orient, NY now has stamps for these four lighthouses. They are different and more readily available than the other stamps for the same lights. Stamps are at the Park Office. Okay to send SASE & donation for copy of stamps.
